


Rate of Confirmed Cases (per 10,000) by Region


Community Cases Outbreak-Related Cases






Proportion (%) of Cases, by Sex (WDG)





Financial implications and recovery



Financial implications and recovery

- Projected year-end variance that requires funding from Safe Restart Phase 1 is estimated at \$5.5 million
 - \$2.7 million for tax supported
 - \$2.8 million for non-tax supported
- Remaining \$6.5 million will be used to offset COVID-19 impacts in Q1 2021

Financial implications and recovery

- Projecting a deficit of \$3.6 million due to:
 - \$19.5 million shortfall in revenue related to COVID-19-related impacts, and
 - \$4.8 million cost increase for COVID-19 expenses
- This deficit has been offset by corresponding \$20.7 million in cost reductions through mitigation efforts

That report "Managing the Impacts of COVID-19: Update 6" dated December 7, 2020 be forwarded to the local MP and MPP, FCM, AMO, LUMCO and the Federal Minister of Finance and the Ministers of Municipal Affairs and Housing and Minister of Finance for the Province of Ontario.
