The Oracle Poll telephone survey reflects 600 statistically significant responses and the EHQ online survey reflects 715 responses.


For the purpose of summarizing data, options of good/very good, poor/very poor and neutral/unsure have been totaled.


Would you have any security concerns with each of the following remote voting methods if the City offered them? Total 99.99% due to rounding.
