



Sign By-law **Delegation of Authority**

- Proposed to delegate authority to grant sign variances that are minor in nature
- Will improve customer response times
- Aligns with Strategic Plan to help businesses succeed and improves how the City delivers service
- Proposed that Council retains authority to hear specific variances and all appeals
- Annual Reporting

A by-law to delegate authority pursuant to the Municipal Act, and to repeal By-law Numbers (2010)-18935, (2010)-19066, (2011)-19204 and (2012)-19380, [amended by By-law (2013)-19529; (2013)-19559; (2013)-19586; (2013)-19596; (2013)-19618; (2014)-19749; (2014)-19792: (2015)-19879: (2016)-20022; (2017)- 20150]; (2018)-20258; (2019)-20375 (2019)-20391; (2019)-20412; (2019)-20439]

WHEREAS section 23.1(1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, authorizes a municipality to delegate its powers and duties subject to certain restrictions:

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Guelph has deemed that certain routine administrative and legislative powers are of a minor nature, and the delegation of these powers would contribute to the efficient management of the City while still adhering to the principles of accountability and

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF GUELPH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:
