


The Matthews property indicated in a detail from an 1858 map of the Township of Guelph (Hobson & Chadwick) (Image: Guelph Civic Museum)

Detail from Ontario Reformatory Plan c. 1921 indicating farmhouse, shed and driveway leading from York Road to the Reformatory building complex.


