Re: Letter of Support for St. Joseph's Health Centre Guelph and The Elliott Community

We, the members of Wellington Ontario Health Team are writing to indicate our support of St. Joseph's Health Centre Guelph (SJHCG) and the Elliott Community ('The Elliott') to build additional Long Term Care (LTC) beds within each of their respective facilities. These new additions will at least partially address the significant demand for LTC that currently exists in our community. Patients waiting for long term care currently account for 28% of the ALC patients at Guelph General Hospital (this number has increased 2-4% over each of the past three years) with the most bed days being attributed to patients who require behavioral supports and secure units. This situation significantly limits flow both within the hospital and across the entire health care system.

Additionally, the additional beds at SJHCG and The Elliott will begin to build capacity towards the projected need for long term beds in our region as a result of our aging population. Over the next 23 years, Waterloo Wellington will need approximately 5600 additional long term care beds¹.

The GW OHT community continues to be challenged by COVID and the secondary impacts of the pandemic. We are experiencing increased demand for emergency and acute care services that are resulting in hallway medicine. This is being compounded by the increasing mismatch between our community's LTC needs and our current LTC capacity. We strongly support SJHCG and The Elliott in their proposals to build additional long term care beds to address our community's current and future needs and we are hopeful that a decision to allocate the new LTC beds occurs expediently to ensure that seniors in our community have appropriate and timely access to LTC.

The membership of Guelph Wellington Ontario Health Team is committed to working with SJHCG on this initiative and are pleased to offer this letter of support.
