## The Corporation of the City of Guelph

## By-law Number (2020) - 20680

A by-law to amend By-Law Number (2000)-16366, as amended by By-Law Number (2013)-19527, being a by-law to prohibit and regulate unusual noise or noises likely to disturb the inhabitants of the City of Guelph.

Whereas the City has previously passed By-Law number (2000)-16366 as amended by By-Law number (2013)-19527 (collectively "By-Law (2000)-16366"), being a by-law to prohibit and regulate noises likely to disturb the inhabitants to the City of Guelph;

And whereas pursuant to the Main Street Recovery Act, 2020, S.O. c.29 - Bill 215, the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25 (the "Act") was amended by adding section 130(1) whereby a municipality does not have the power to prohibit and regulate noise made in the municipality in connection with the delivery of goods to certain businesses, except as authorized by regulation under the Act

And whereas the City wishes to amend the By-Law (2000)-16366;

## The Council of the Corporation of the City of Guelph enacts as follows:

1. Section 3.1. - General exemptions is amended by adding the new following subsection:

"viii. to the delivery of goods to any of the following, except as otherwise authorized by regulation under the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended:

- a) Retail business establishments;
- b) Restaurants, including cafes and bars;
- c) Hotels and motels;
- d) Goods distribution facilities."
- 2. In all other respects By-Law (2000)-16366 remains unchanged.
- 3. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on September 19, 2021.
