• Formed (incorporated) in April 2022 to provide a collective voice for pickleball in Guelph

Mission

Foster growth and promote pickleball for all ages, skill levels and abilities Provide safe and suitable playing venues and programming through existing and new facilities Be a fulsome resource for services, information, equipment, training and development

THE WORLD OF PICKLEBALL

PICKLEBALL IS A BIG THING

- Widely acknowledged to be the fastest-growing sport in North America - Sports & Fitness Industry Association, Pickleball Canada, Pickleball USA
- Projected to grow (USA) from 5 million players to 40 million players by 2030
- Canada currently has 1 million players
- Pickleball is in the conversation as a potential Olympic sport for 2028
- An all-ages sport that is easy to learn, engaging and highly social
- Low cost of entry
- It has become a significant economic engine
- Professional pickleball has become a legitimate career
- National Pickleball Day (August)
- There are national (Pickleball Canada) and provincial governing organizations (Pickleball Ontario)
- Most municipalities have now built dedicated pickleball facilities
- Pickleball associations (ie: PGA) exist in virtually every municipality
- Playing facilities are an integral component of healthy-living and social engagement

THE GUELPH PICKLEBALL STORY

What We Know

- Guelph has a total of 95 parks: 34 parks have baseball diamonds, 20 parks have basketball courts, 77 parks have soccer fields, 12 parks have tennis courts and 6 parks have sand volleyball courts. *There are no dedicated outdoor pickleball courts*
- There are anecdotally 700 + players in Guelph, not including school-age players
- Pickleball growth is strong in Guelph with no signs of abating
- The catchment area is significantly under serviced when it comes to meeting the high demand for dedicated outdoor and indoor pickleball courts
- There are waiting lists for indoor play and outdoor play can't be organized given the multiuse situation and City booking policies

Pickleball will continue to grow at a robust pace. The door is wide open to new initiatives and it all starts with a vision that can become a reality at the Guelph Pickleball Courts

ROBUST INTEREST DESERVES ROBUST ACTION

Making It Happen

This Pickleball Guelph Association (PGA) proposes to enter into a relationship with the City of Guelph to create a dedicated outdoor facility as well as pursue opportunities to create an indoor pickleball performance centre

What Does That Mean?

- Receive endorsement from Council to proceed with development
- Form a project team to source out playing locations and collectively manage opportunities and issues. There are options for outdoor courts that can be considered and feasibility work can begin in 2023
- Acquire funding through the City and acquire support from other sources such as grants, sponsorships, donations, naming rights and the PGA
- Create an operational model for programming, player development and scheduling.
- Introduce programming to engage players of all ages and deliver family and community-based programs
- The City has an opportunity to service the unfulfilled demand for pickleball courts and pave the way for future growth of this wonderful sport

THE GUELPH PICKLEBALL COURTS

CONSIDERATIONS

Outdoor

- Construct a new dedicated outdoor facility
- Repurpose existing outdoor courts (convert tennis to pickleball)
 one tennis court converts to 3 or 4 pickleball courts


Indoor

- Construct a new dedicated indoor facility
- Repurpose an existing facility (ice arena, warehouse, etc.)

Funding Estimates (outdoor courts)

- Repurpose (5 8 courts): est. \$250 \$500k
- New construction (10 courts): est. \$800K \$1.2K

LAYOUTS FOR OUTDOOR COURTS



NEW Pickleball Courts - (10) with Common/viewing area, plus Storage Shed/Washroom(s). PLUS Asphalt Pad 36 X 36 Ft - to build 20 X 20 Ft Storage Shed & Washroom(s) with Practice walls

The Guelph Pickleball Courts

- 10 outdoor pickleball courts
- Seating (players and spectators)
- Washroom facilities
- Windscreens
- Lights
- Storage
- Capacity to expand

GUELPH IS OPEN FOR PICKLEBALL

- New recreational services for Guelph (address the demand)
- Family-friendly facility and community-oriented
- Positive reputational impact (great place to live and play)
- Enhanced awareness of Guelph through players and events
