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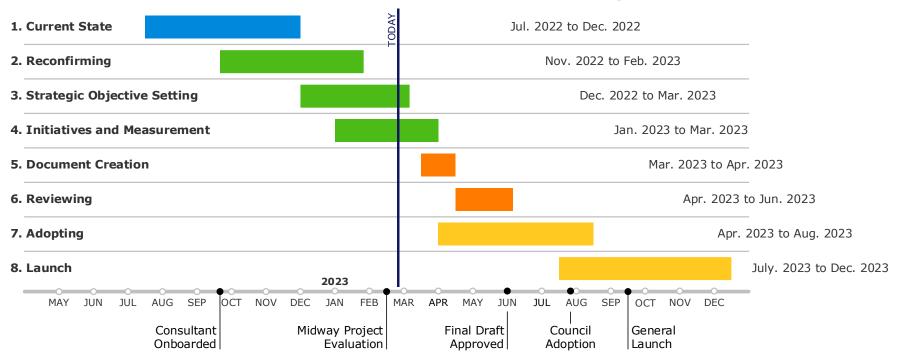
Introduction

Importance of the multi-year budget

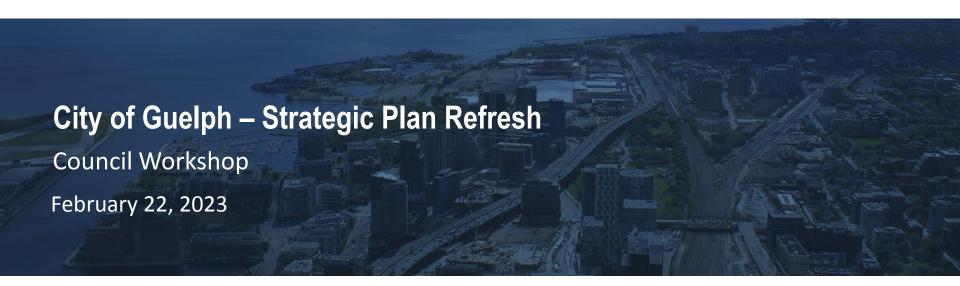
- Budget determines the speed and timing of the strategic plan's implementation.
- A strategic plan with long-term funding plans improves our performance and maximize taxpayer dollars.
- Budget is informed by:
 - The strategic plan;
 - Master plans and the official plan;
 - Base-level service obligations; and
 - Economic and inflationary factors and pressures.
