#### 2. Committee Items

## 1. Formalizing an Adopt-A-Space Community Stewardship Program

The Committee provided the following comments:

# Question 1: Are there potential benefits or drawbacks of the program to consider?

- The Committee indicated the following benefits:
  - o Provides an opportunity to leverage funding
  - o Helps the City get more things done
  - Enables a strategic approach to community stewardship
- The Committee provided the following questions:
  - o Will there be City funding support for groups?
  - o Can reporting of 'infractions' be included in the program?

# Question 2: Are there key stewardship ideas or activities that are being missed or any issues with the suggested activities?

- The Committee indicated the following missing activities:
  - Training (e.g. species identification, techniques)
  - Trail maintenance
  - Community science (e.g. ebird, bumblebee watch)
- The Committee also suggested that "people" be included in the definition of stewardship

## Question 3: Is a minimum time commitment for participants needed?

- The Committee indicated the following:
  - Any required time commitment, at least at first, should not be too onerous or it may reduce participation; once

- participants are used to the program perhaps can increase the requirement
- A requirement for only one event per year may not be enough to maintain a connection to a space; could define 'event' broadly to improve accessibility / participation

# Question 4: Do you have questions or concerns about the proposed program model?

- The Committee indicated the following:
  - The need for insurance may appear daunting; make sure the requirements are easy and well communicated to avoid reduced participation

# Question 5: Have we missed something important before rolling this out and communicating about it more publicly? Do you have ideas to help communicate/spread the word of the program?

- The Committee indicated the following:
  - The City's role in the program should include orientation (e.g. rules, health and safety) and helping groups to develop a stewardship management plan
  - The City should facilitate celebrating success with groups (e.g. bbq, signage, email, newsletter, lunch, gift)
  - The City should consider providing groups with a budget for refreshments during events
  - The City should help connect groups with the partner organizations
  - The City should clearly communicate how groups can sign up to the program
  - There should be a minimum number of people required for a group; suggest three people
  - Outreach to partner organizations will be important; as grant deadlines are often in December, they may need to understand their involvement ahead of then
  - Ideas to help encourage participation:
    - Large activities planned by the City

- Advertise at partner organization events
- Hold an information session

# Question 6: Are there natural areas spaces/projects where community stewardship is needed/would be appropriate?

- The Committee indicated the following:
  - Howitt Park Phragmites population
  - The City should develop a list of places with associated activities for potential groups to consider

- The Committee provided the following suggestions:
  - Nature Stewards
  - o Guelph Caretaker Stewardship Program
  - Greenspace Caretakers
  - Champions of Nature
  - Guelph Neighbourhood Nature Caretakers
  - Space Savers Stewardship Program
