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Redesigning Advisory Committees of Council – Phase Two

- City Council approved the <u>ACOC Governance Framework</u> in November 2023 (phase 1 of this project)
- Phase 2 is a review of all existing ACOCs to ensure alignment with the Framework
- Expansion or reduction of mandates, mergers, dissolutions and the creation of new ACOCs are all possible outcomes
- City Council has approved resources to support 7-10 ACOCs, the City currently has 14 ACOCs

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- The project team (City Clerk's Office and the Guelph Lab) will meet with every ACOC twice as part of phase 2, once in the winter/spring and again in the summer/fall
- ACOC chairs will be invited to a workshop before the second round of ACOC meetings
- No specific decisions about or changes to ACOCs have been contemplated at this point in the project



ACOC Governance Framework Commitments

- 1. ACOCs are an important form of community engagement.
- 2. ACOCs should help shape the City's strategic goals.
- 3. ACOCs should adopt a deliberative approach.
- 4. ACOCs should contribute lived and professional expertise.
- 5. ACOCs should include members with diverse identities and perspectives.
- 6. There should be clear communication between ACOCs and City Council.
- 7. ACOCs should be adequately resourced.
