Municipal benchmarking for free transit and parking on Election Day

City of Greater Sudbury (comparator)

- Offers free transit for the municipal election.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections.
- Free transit is established in perpetuity through a 2017 by-law.

City of Waterloo (comparator)

 Council passed a motion passed ahead of 2022 to ask the Region to consider offering free transit on Election Day though this was no approved by the Region.

City of Cambridge (comparator)

 Council passed a motion passed ahead of 2022 to ask the Region to consider offering free transit on Election Day though this was no approved by the Region.

City of Windsor

- Free transit services are offered on advanced voting days and Election Day.
- Free parking is offered in municipal parking lots on voting days as well.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections as this has never been requested.

City of North Bay

- Free transit services offered for voters with their voter card on Election Day.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections.

City of Sarnia

- Free transit rides are offered for all riders on Election Day.
- This is used as an initiative to remove barriers to voting.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections.

Town of Collingwood

- Free transit services on advanced voting days and on Election Day.
- Free parking in municipal parking lots offered on voting days as well.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections as this has never been requested.

City of Kingston (comparator)

- Offers free transit services with proof of voter card.
- Similar transit service is offered for federal and provincial elections but this is a Transit initiative only.
- All voting locations have free parking.

City of Oakville (comparator)

- Offers free transit passes on request if a voter identifies transportation as a barrier to access voting.
- Does not offer it for federal or provincial elections as this has never been requested.
