## Why Guelph would benefit from a Centre for Visual Arts

Play. The word has a childish connotation: child's play, play acting, playful. As such we don't think much about it in terms of its' value. Some even regard it as something you do when you are not working or being productive.

In fact play, is when you are at your most productive. It is through playing that humans collaborate, cooperate and solve problems, big problems like climate change, economic disparity, a housing crisis, and crippling mental health issues. Communities that have a high level of respect for art and play are the communities that thrive. They are the most desirable places to live and work. They attract the very best. Understanding this, is how your community creates a River Run Centre, Recreation Facilities, A Library, an Arts Council and soon a Guelph Centre for Visual Arts. Be brave. Show leadership. Let neighbouring municipalities know that Guelph understands the value of play – cooperation, collaboration, community, inclusiveness, and the courage to tackle problems through creative play. Its how we get things done, by playing, or if you prefer this term "hard work". Same thing only it sounds like a whole lot more fun...and it is.
