Woodlawn Memorial Park Candidate Cultural Heritage Landscape

- Between the Lakes Treaty (No. 3), negotiated in 1784 and ratified in 1792.
- Heritage Attributes:
 - Primary cemetery serving the City of Guelph and surrounding areas, established 1853
 - Prominent, central location at junctions of Highways 6 and 7
 - "Garden cemetery" design of mid-to-late 1800s with park-like, rolling topography, ornamental shrubs and mature trees, wide-spaced Victorian gravestones
 - Late nineteenth/early twentieth-century Greco Revival mausoleum, Gothic Revival buildings and stone gates







Proposed design from Woodlawn Road to 260m




Proposed design from 260m to 540m from Woodlawn Road

Heritage Impact Assessment Recommendations

- **Trail railing** blend in with its surroundings (muted green or brown)
- Retaining wall low as possible and be visually compatible with the cemetery (stone masonry or concrete masonry to look like stone)
- **Benches** design cues taken from the cemetery (traditional slatted park bench design)
- Construction impacts Mitigate dirt and dust through post construction maintenance and restoration
