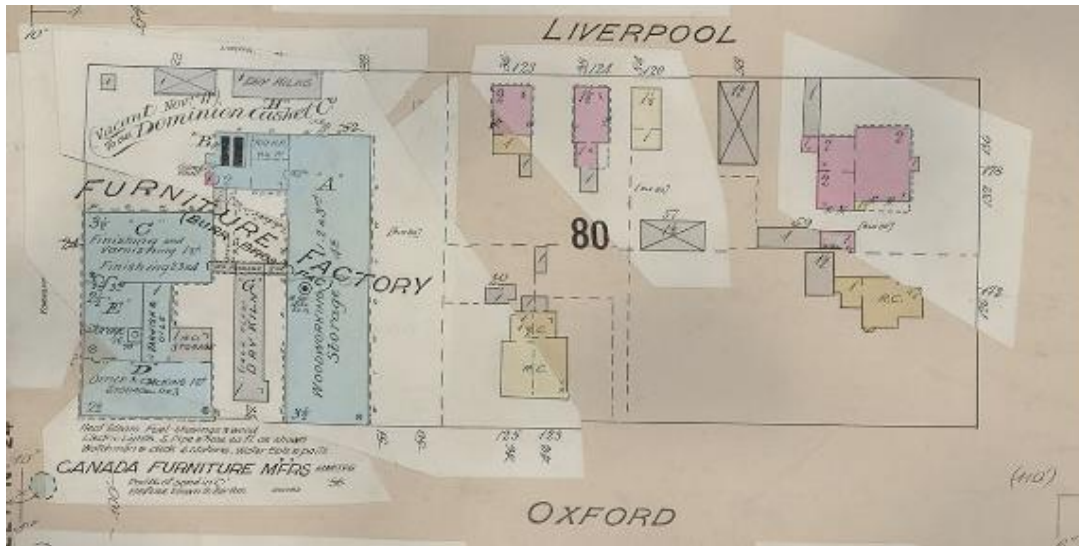


Figure 6: Detail from Fire Insurance Plan 1897 (revised 1911) showing 136 Glasgow Street N. and Dominion Casket Co Ltd. (Guelph Civic Museum, 2013.39.1)

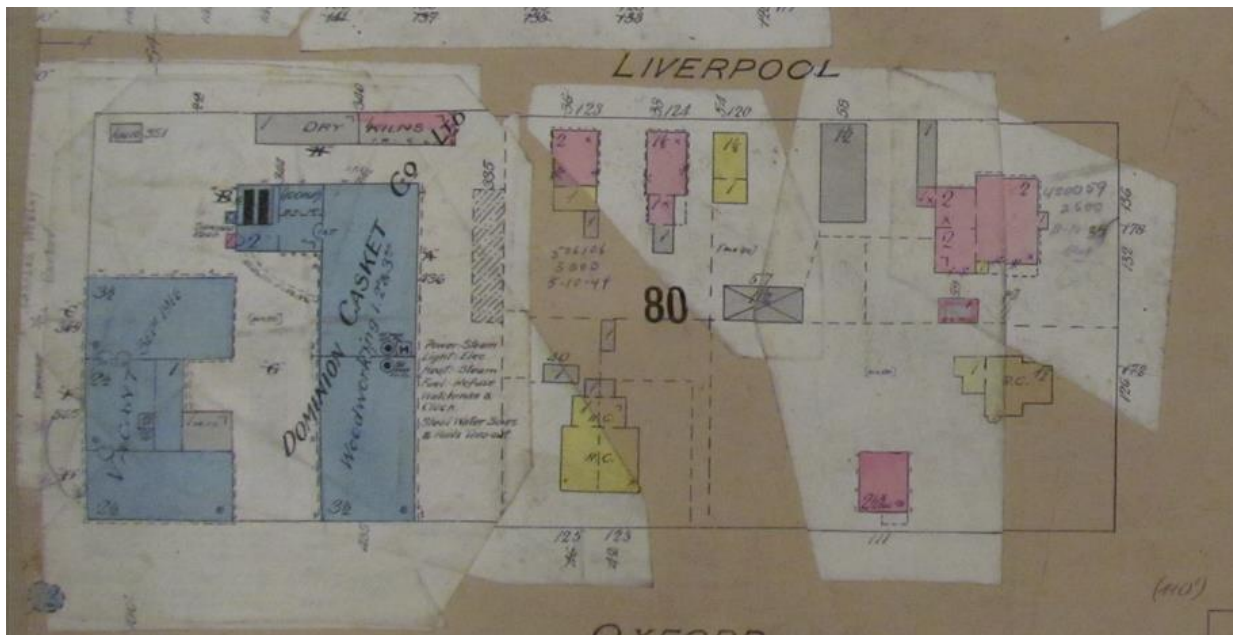


Figure 7: Detail from Fire Insurance Plan 1920 showing 136 Glasgow Street N. and W.J. Armstrong Ltd.

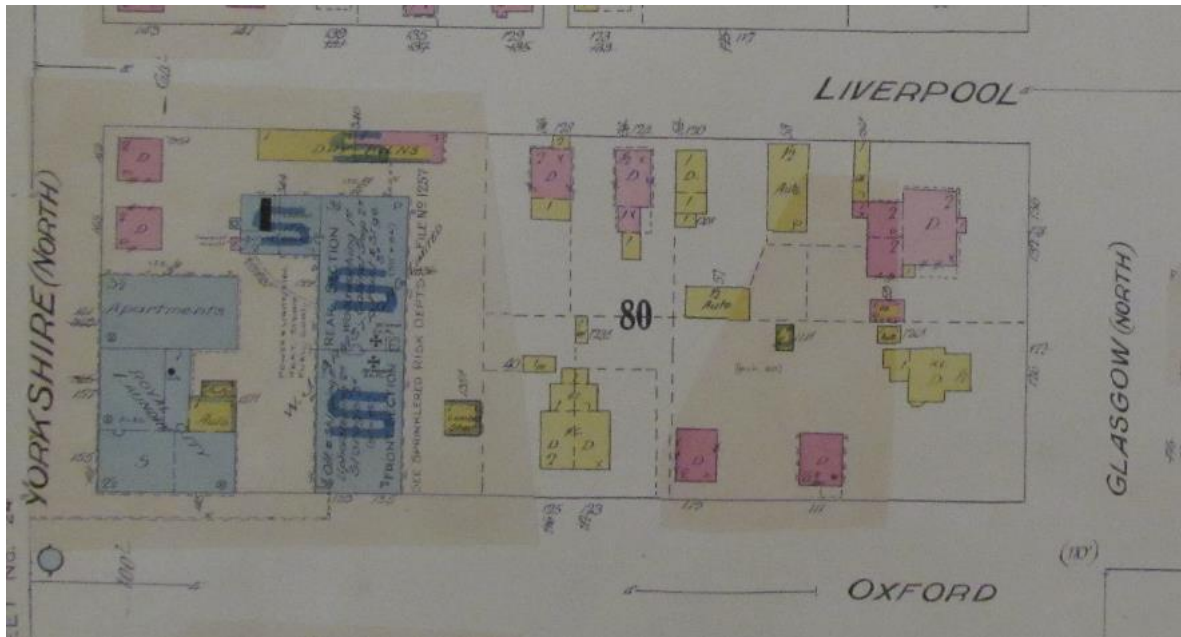


Figure 8: Detail from Fire Insurance Plan 1922 showing 136 Glasgow Street N. and W.J. Armstrong Ltd.

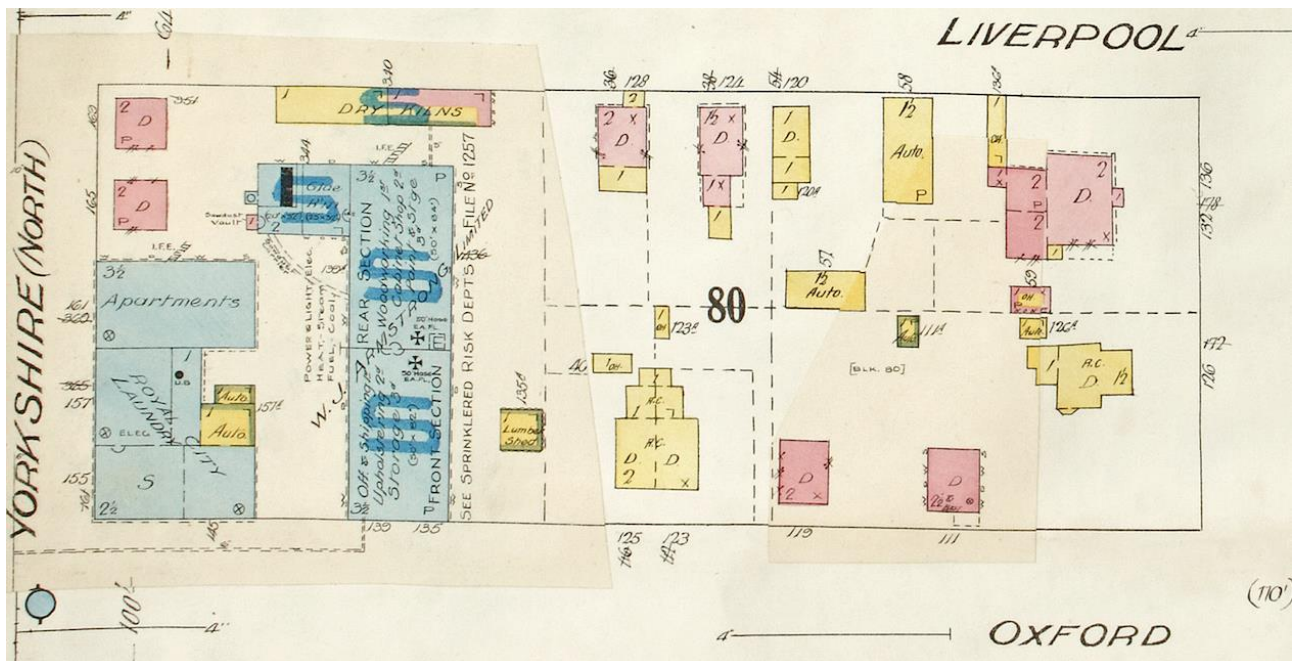


Figure 11: Gowdy Residence being used as a reference point for lots for sale (Guelph Daily Mercury, 15 Oct 1877)
