

I am writing to express my support of Councillor Caton's motion that will be voted on December 11th at City Council that states: "That Guelph City Council opposes the use of the Notwithstanding Clause as requested by a collection of Ontario Mayors, to circumvent the courts ability to rule on Charter Rights on the subject of encampment relocations due to municipal bylaws throughout Ontario." The motion also says that Council opposes the use of force in involuntary treatment of people with substance abuse disorders or mental illness.
