- Reducing health inequities.



Harm Reduction

- Added needle drop boxes in Guelph bringing the total to 19
- Distributed harm reduction supplies and Naloxone to 14 community partners
- Brought the Guelph Public Library onboard as a Naloxone distributor

Healthy Babies Healthy Children

- Completed 38 prenatal, 2012 postpartum and 72 early childhood screens
- Served 144 families in 2024

Healthy Environments

Rabies

- Investigated 1,077 animal exposures (bites) in 2024
- Gave post-exposure prophylaxis to prevent rabies in 92 individuals

Safe Water

- 100% (73) of adverse water quality incidents responded to within 24 hours
- 74 Class A and Class B pools and 16 spas routinely inspected each year

Vectorborne Disease

- 105,108 catch basin treatments performed in 2023
- 131 black legged ticks identified

Immunization

Total Immunizations

 Administered nearly 22,000 doses of vaccines in 2024, including ~4,000 doses of COVID-19 and ~4,000 flu vaccines

Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) – 2024/25 School Year

- WDGPH led 220 dedicated clinics during the 2024/25 school year
- Achieved 90.5% coverage for measles across elementary and high school students

Annually inspect:

- 457 personal service settings
- 71 before/after school care
- 76 full-service childcare centres

Complaint-based:

 29 inspections following community complaints in 2024

Reportable Diseases

- 1108 Reportable disease investigations
- 197 facility outbreaks
- TB program delivered 700 tuberculin skin tests

Sexual Health

 Provided 803 sexual health and 286 reproductive health appointments

Alcohol

 Solicited and analysed 2565 complete responses for the 2024 Alcohol Survey

Cannabis

 Developed and shared 6 cannabis resources with 47 partners and the public

Tobacco

- Youth Test Shoppers evaluated 369 tobacco retailers and 151 vape retailers in WDG
- 16 Secondary school inspections
- 348 Display and promotion inspections

Children

- Performed 15,751 oral health screenings
- 1,419 fluoride applications
- Identified 952 students (33.7%) with decayed, missing and filled teeth in SK
- 1,620 children seen in WDGPH preventative clinics

Seniors Dental Care Program

- 630 seniors seen by WDGPH dentist
- 810 clients seen by dental hygienist

Public Health responds to reports of **key diseases** that pose a risk to the community.

1,032 cases (confirmed + probable) in 2024

Looking To The Future


Innovation in Public Health

- Piloting voicemail transcription technology
